Who's next? - security, forklift drivers, production!

Fosters Australia – whose profit continues to rise – may want to replace their maintenance crew of close to 100 with a labour hire company. This means the 100 permanent jobs will be lost and replaced with temporary, casual, call-in – and fewer – workers.

But this is the thin edge of the wedge. Why would management stop at just 100 workers....when the workforce is 7,000? History has shown Fosters is keen to outsource - some forklift drivers have been targetted and rumours exist about outsourcing of maintenance in Yatala in Queensland.
